In Memoriam Ghery Pettit 6SEP1926 - 17MAY2009



Ghery was born in Oakland, CA, graduated from Tamalpais High School in 1942, joined the Navy in 1944. After his discharge in 1946 he attended the U of C, Davis where he received his D.V.M. in 1953. In 1961 he was offered a position at the School of Veterinary Medicine at WSU. He retired in 1991 as Prof. of Veterinary Clinical Medicine and Surgery.

Ghery was an elder in the Pullman Presbyterian Church, a past commander of the Post 52 of the American Legion, a past President of the WSU Retiree's Association, and a very active member in the Kiwanis Club of Pullman which he joined in April of 1996.

He is survived by his wife of 60 years, Frances, and sons, Ghery and Paul, and two grandchildren Ghery and Heather.
